Narrative Report

Since 1978 I have been a member of the Medical Psychiatry Service at Brigham and Women's Hospital (BWH) and at the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute (DFCI). In addition to teaching general psychiatry to medical students, psychiatric residents, fellows and non-psychiatric clinicians, I have developed academic interests related to psychological aspects of oncology, the management of addiction, the interface between psychiatry and spirituality/religion, and moral and ethical aspects of practice.

In 1978 I became the DFCI's adult psychiatric consultant, from 1998 to 2008 was the Clinical Director or Co-Director of Psychosocial Oncology of Dana-Farber Partners Cancer Care. In this capacity I provided psychiatric consultation, treatment and referral for oncology patients and their family members, taught oncology staff and trainees, helped to develop an integrated model of care. I have also led collaborative research in areas such as the management of pain, giving a diagnosis of cancer, and the development of attitudes of oncology clinicians. I currently serve as the Dana-Farber Site Director of the Psychosomatic Medicine Fellowship based at Brigham and Women's Hospital, and co-direct an elective for fourth year medical students, Psychosocial Oncology and Palliative Medicine.

From 1988 to 1993, I was the Medical Director of the BWH Alcohol and Drug Service, and have played an active role in developing and supporting its successor, the Addiction Psychiatry Service. I teach medical students, residents and fellows about addiction, and have published clinical approaches to patients with complex addiction related, medical and psychiatric problems.

My work with patients with life-threatening illness and with addiction has enhanced my career interest in clarifying the existential dimension of their suffering, and the spiritual dimension of the physician's role. I have taught and co-directed medical school courses dealing with spirituality and medicine, and developed with Mary McCarthy, M.D. a course for PGIV psychiatric residents, "Religion, Spirituality and Psychiatry" that received a John Templeton curriculum award in 1998. I have served as the Chair of the American Psychiatric Association's Corresponding Committee on Religion, Spirituality and Psychiatry and written and spoken extensively on the clinical implications of spirituality. Dr. Allan Josephson and I co-edited the book *A Handbook of Spirituality and World View in Clinical Practice*. Currently, I am co-editing two additional books in this area, one dealing with religious and spiritual issues in psychiatric diagnosis, and the other with the role of spirituality in the practice of medicine generally.

Finally, I have taught and written about the moral and ethical aspects of practice, in papers, and in the book, *Doing the Right Thing: An Approach to Moral Issues in Mental Health Treatment*.
