M. RESEARCH AND TEACHING

I am Head of the Research Department of Mental Health Sciences at University College London Medical School; Co-Director of the UK CRC registered Primary Care & Mental Health Clinical Trials Unit (www.priment.mrc.ac.uk); and Co-Director of the UCL London Research Design Service (www.rdslondon.co.uk). I have dual clinical training in general practice and psychiatry and am an experienced epidemiologist, trialist and health services researcher who has specialised in primary care mental health research and development for 25 years. I have led on large-scale international mental health research including European Commission funded projects in continental Europe and South America, and the evaluation of effective treatments in primary care mental health in India. Some of my work includes: 1) Leading on the development of the first ever risk algorithm to predict the onset of major depression in general practice attenders in Europe; 2) Establishing a primary care research network in Goa India (with Professor Irwin Nazareth); and 3) applying this network in collaboration on a large scale Wellcome funded RCT of treatments for common mental disorders in India (CI Vikram Patel). I have played a significant role in capacity building and training of mental health expertise in UCL through the award of a large number of MRC funded Fellowship awards and PhD studentships. This has been extended internationally with my position as the UK lead on the international Maristán network that has coordinated a series of PhD programmes and empirical research in South America (<http://redmaristan.org/>). Examples of research into practice are: brief psychotherapy in general practice (NICE); management of schizophrenia in general practice (NICE); sexual dysfunction in women (DSMV draft); sexual assault (current UK rape law); stigma of illness causing death, e.g. AIDS (UK law on death certification); and parenting (UK adoption laws).

I direct the Sexual Problems Clinic for the Camden and Islington NHS Foundation Trust. This is the main psychosexual service for central and north-east London.
